Is that fair? No...but God's forgiveness is loving and good and bigger than "fair."

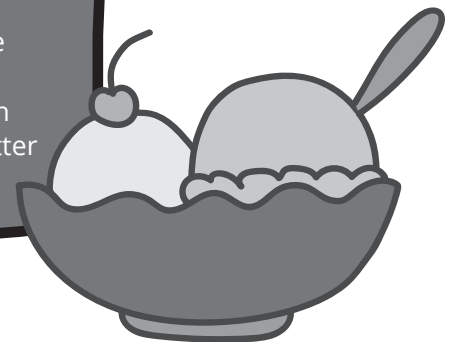
So don't worry when sometimes life isn't fair. Instead, be thankful that God is good, and God is there, even when life's unfair!

Solomon was given great wisdom by God, and he wrote about life being unfair. See if you agree with him! Read Ecclesiastes 9:11-12.



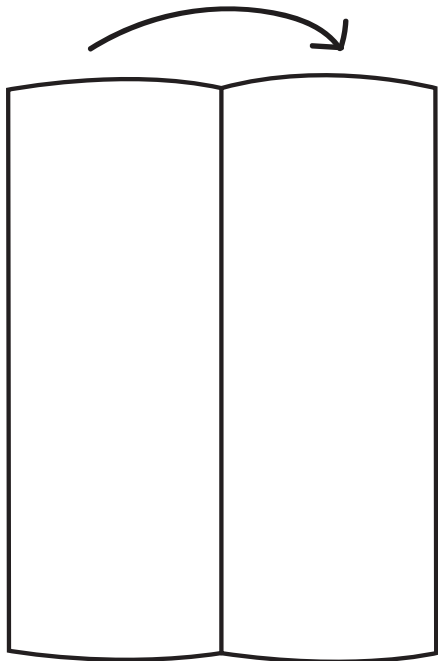
Make this page fly home!

Fold a flyer. When you get home, ask a parent—

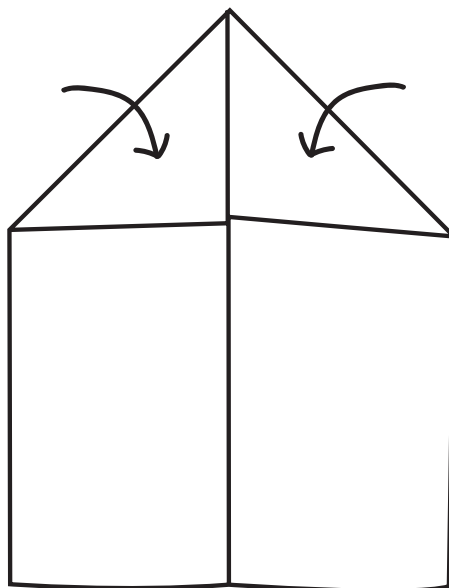
...to hold up a bowl of ice cream and see if you can land your plane in it. No? Well, at least you can share some ice cream with your parent!

Here's how:

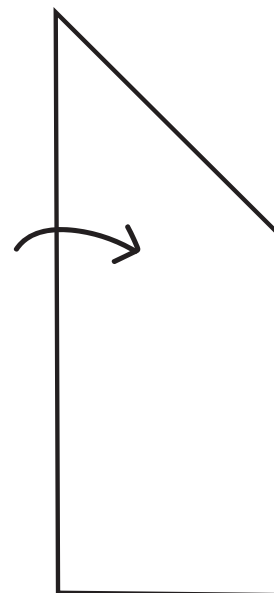
- 1 Fold the paper in half lengthwise as shown.



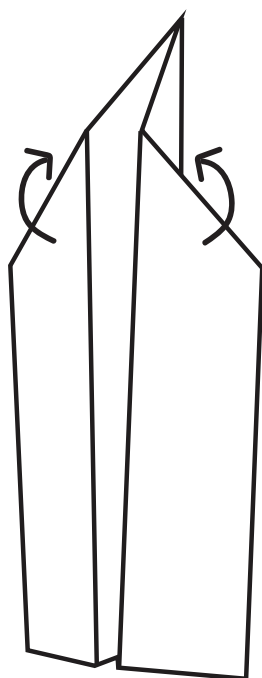
- 2 Unfold, and then fold the top two corners to the center line to create flaps.



- 3 Once again, fold the paper in half.



- 4 Fold the edges down to meet the bottom of the airplane body.



- 5 Take aim, and let it fly!
